Church Coordinator Checklist

Forms and money due April 15th!

The original and one copy of all individual registration forms are due with the remaining \$50 per person fees. **NO ADDITIONS OF CAMPERS OR SUBSTITUTES 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO THEIR CAMP.** Verify that you have:

- _____ Proof of Insurance for everyone, all blanks completed and 2 adults for every 5 youth
- _____ **One vehicle suitable for work for every adult (unless discussed with Director)**
- _____ All youth will have completed the 6th grade
- _____ Make camp meeting date available for all adults (**Church Coordinator is required to attend**)
- _____ Group Roster signed by the Senior Minister verifying the adults

One Month prior to camp:

- _____ Make available camp rules and communicating values to all adult volunteers who will attend
- _____ Fund raising activities complete
- _____ Trailer for tool transportation confirmed

Two weeks prior to camp:

- _____ Tool, cleaning and first aid kits ready
- _____ Materials being taken to camp collected
- _____ Have participants complete their tool kits for you inspection
- _____ Individuals initials or names on tools and color-coded
- _____ Have parent/camper meeting for rules/packing list
- _____ Communicate all changes to group roster to BIG HOUSE office and Director of Camp

One-week prior to camp:

- _____ One ice chest per car collected, labeled and color coded
- _____ One 3-5 gallon water cooler per car, labeled and color coded
- _____ Label all other tools with individual's initials and color-coded
- _____ Church color assigned by the Camp Director
- _____ Leave church location and phone # list

Wednesday before camp:

- _____ Load tool trailer (responsibility of participating church, not supplied by **BIG HOUSE**)
- _____ Collect individual tools to load
- _____ Load ice chests and water coolers
- _____ Load sleeping bags and cots

Thursday of camp:

- _____ Sending off from home church (ask minister to join you in this)
- _____ Arrive at **BIG HOUSE** at 4PM for check in. – **We will be eating dinner on Thursday night as a camp so your prompt arrival is a necessity.**

Registration Information

A space is reserved for your group at a work camp when the group registration form and the deposit check are received in the BIG HOUSE TEXAS office (first come-first served). The deposit of **\$50 per person is non-refundable**. The total registration fee is **\$100 per person**.

Example:

10 pre-registered participants x \$50.00 deposit = \$500.00 (NON REFUNDABLE)
7 participants attend camp.
Your total registration fees equal 7 X 100 = \$700
Total owed minus deposit = \$200
The total amount you will have paid is \$700 for the 7 participants who attend.

Fees for Late forms

After April 15th – You will owe \$110 per form
After May 1st – You will owe \$130 per form
After May 15th – Executive Directors decision

REGISTRATION FEES

Group registration fees: \$50.00 per person (October 1, 2010-January 1, 2012)

Remaining registration fees: \$50.00 per person (unless forms are late)

Total registration fee: \$100.00 per person (unless forms are late)

Registrations will be accepted on a first come first served basis beginning October 1, 2011. No group is registered until this form and the registration fees reach the BIG HOUSE office.

Group registration fees are due no later than January 1, 2012. Most work camps are full by January 1st.

BIG HOUSE Camp Rules

BIG HOUSE is for those willing to do plain, honest, sweaty, awesome work to help others! Few rules are needed since participants join with common goals of work, service and Christian fellowship. The rules are to enhance the work camp experience and to continue the reputation of **BIG HOUSE** as a caring, effective and responsible group of people.

It is impossible to cover every rule of safety and appropriate behavior, but the rules listed below are a few of the most basic ones necessary for a safe, enriching experience:

1. Conduct will be appropriate for a church activity
2. Participants will conduct themselves in a thoughtful and safe manner at all times
3. Participants will follow the directions of the camp leadership; youth or adults won't tolerate insubordination. The Camp Director on advisement by the Executive Director has the authority to do what he/she deems necessary.
4. Possession or consumption of alcohol, illegal drugs, tobacco, or weapons is strictly prohibited.
5. **No one may enter the dorm area of the opposite sex.**
6. **Everyone participates in all events**
7. Radios, tape/disc players, DVD players, MP 3, and other sound equipment are not allowed. No cell phones for the youth. No music will be allowed on the worksite. **BIG HOUSE** will not replace any lost or stolen items.
8. Refer to the page on the dress code. No one may wear clothes that might be objectionable. The Camp Director has the discretion to do what is necessary in dealing with inappropriate clothing.
9. No one may leave the base camp at anytime during camp unless authorized by the Camp Director to do so.
10. No youth or adult may arrive at camp late or leave camp early. The takes away from the camp experience.
11. No paint fights or body painting

Vehicle Rules:

- A. No youth participant may ride as a passenger in a vehicle driven by anyone under the age of 21 during camp except as stipulated in the emergency procedures.
- B. No one may ride in the back of a truck or trailer. All people must ride inside the vehicles with seatbelts buckled at all times.
- C. All safe-driving procedures must be observed and drivers must have current driver license and insurance.
- D. No youth participant may drive a vehicle during camp.
- E. No texting while driving!!!!

BIG HOUSE reserves the right to determine any inappropriate behavior and to send a participant home in disciplinary cases.

BIG HOUSE Dress Code

As a representative of **BIG HOUSE** we wish to glorify God in all we do.
Especially the way we present ourselves to others in the community.
Remember we are God's ambassadors here on earth.

On Site

- **No open toe shoes! We prefer work boots or tennis shoes.**
- **No tube tops, spaghetti straps or sleeveless shirts! T-shirts are the best.**
- **Shorts must be a modest length! Shorts must fall at natural waistline for both boys and girls.**

If there are any questions as to what is modest, your camp director will be the final say. These rules also apply to the adults. Just remind your adults and college leaders that they set the example for the youth and if they don't follow the dress code neither will the youth. The director of your camp will have an extra box of T-shirts so that if someone is dressed inappropriately they will be asked to change. Remember we are not the fashion police, and this is not the focus of the camp. Please help remind the youth what is appropriate and what is not, in a loving way.

At Base Camp

These rules not only apply while at base camp but also wherever your camp may go for evening activities.

- **No tube tops or spaghetti straps!**
- **Shorts must be a modest length! Shorts must fall at natural waistline for boys and girls.**
- **Modest swimsuits please – For girls one piece or tankini would be nice!**
- **No Speedos- boys**

COMMUNICATING VALUES BIG HOUSE ADULT VOLUNTEERS

Big House Texas Covenant of Conduct

7. Radios, CD players, MP 3's, DVD's game boys, Cell phones (FOR YOUTH) etc. are not allowed. No music will be allowed on the worksite. BIG HOUSE TEXAS will not replace any lost or stolen items.
8. Refer to the page on dress code. No one may wear clothes that might be objectionable. The Camp Director has the discretion to do what is necessary in dealing with inappropriate clothing.
9. No one may leave the base camp at anytime during camp unless authorized by the Camp Director to do so.
10. No youth or adult may arrive at camp late or leave camp early. This takes away from the camp experience.
11. No paint fights - painting yourself or others! No water guns, or water slides on the worksite!

Vehicle Rules are as follows:

- A. No youth participant may ride as a passenger in a vehicle driven by anyone under the age of 21 during camp except as stipulated in emergency procedures.
- B. No one may ride in the back of a truck or trailer. All people must ride inside the vehicles with seat belts buckled at all times.
- C. All safe driving procedures must be observed and drivers must have current drivers license and insurance.
- D. NO YOUTH participant may drive a vehicle during camp.

BIG HOUSE TEXAS reserves the right to determine any inappropriate behavior and to send a participant home in disciplinary cases!
